RESOLUTION NO. 145

THE RESOLUTION **OF** CITY **OF** SHORELINE, A WASHINGTON, DECLARING THE INTENT OF THE CITY COUNCIL TO ADOPT THE RIGHT OF INITIATIVE AND REFERENDUM FOR THE OUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE **PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION** OF CITY; **THIS RESOLUTION: PROVIDING THAT UPON AND** THE EXPIRATION OF THE NINETIETH DAY AFTER THE DATE OF PUBLICATION THAT AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE INITIATIVE AND REFERENDUM PROCESS FOR **OUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY SHALL BE PRESENTED TIMELY** SUFFICIENT UNLESS AND REFERENDUM PETITION HAS BEEN FILED REFERRING THE QUESTION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY FOR APPROVAL OR REJECTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to RCW 35A.11.080, which permits the legislative body of a noncharter code city, such as the City of Shoreline, to provide for the exercise in the City of the powers of initiative and referendum in accordance with the provisions of state law set forth in RCW 35A.020.020, et seq, the City Council of the City of Shoreline, Washington, a noncharter Optional Municipal Code city, hereby declares its intention to adopt for the City the powers of initiative and referendum.

Section 2. Within ten (10) days following the passage of this resolution the City Clerk is instructed to cause this resolution to be published at least once in a newspapers of general circulation within the City, to wit: *The Shoreline Week* and *The Seattle Times*.

Section 3. Notice is given that upon the expiration of the ninetieth day from, but excluding the date of first publication of the resolution, if no timely and sufficient referendum petition is filed pursuant to RCW 35A.02.035, as determined by RCW 35A.29.170, the intent expressed in this resolution shall, at the next regular meeting of the City Council, be effected by an ordinance adopting for the City the powers of initiative and referendum.
