RESOLUTION NO. 126

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE MERIDIAN PARK NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION TO PROCEED WITH EXPENDITURE OF ITS OFFICE OF NEIGHBORHOODS MINI-GRANT FUNDS

WHEREAS, the 1996 budget of the City of Shoreline allocated \$5,000 for neighborhood enhancement in each of Shoreline's 12 neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Neighborhoods Mini-Grant funding provided by the City will be matched by the participating neighborhood in a donation of cash, goods, or labor equal to the value of the City grant funding; and

WHEREAS, the Meridian Park Neighborhood Association has submitted a grant application for this program, which has reviewed by City staff; and

WHEREAS, the Meridian Park Neighborhood Association has joined together with the Meridian Park School in the completion of an early childhood community playground at the school which will serve all children, including those with physical disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Meridian Park Neighborhood Association wishes to foster community identity and encourage involvement by facilitating the efficient dissemination of information and materials to the residents of the Meridian Park neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 54 requires City Council approval of expenditure of Office of Neighborhoods Mini-Grant funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHORELINE, WASHINGTON AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. <u>Authorization</u>. The City Council hereby approves the expenditure of \$4,150 of Office of Neighborhoods Mini-Grant funding for the Meridian Park Neighborhood Association playground project and neighborhood communication.

Section 2. Recording of Mini-Grant Application. The Meridian Park Neighborhood Association Office of Neighborhoods Mini-Grant application has been filed with the City Clerk and given Clerk's Receiving Number 306.
